Project update

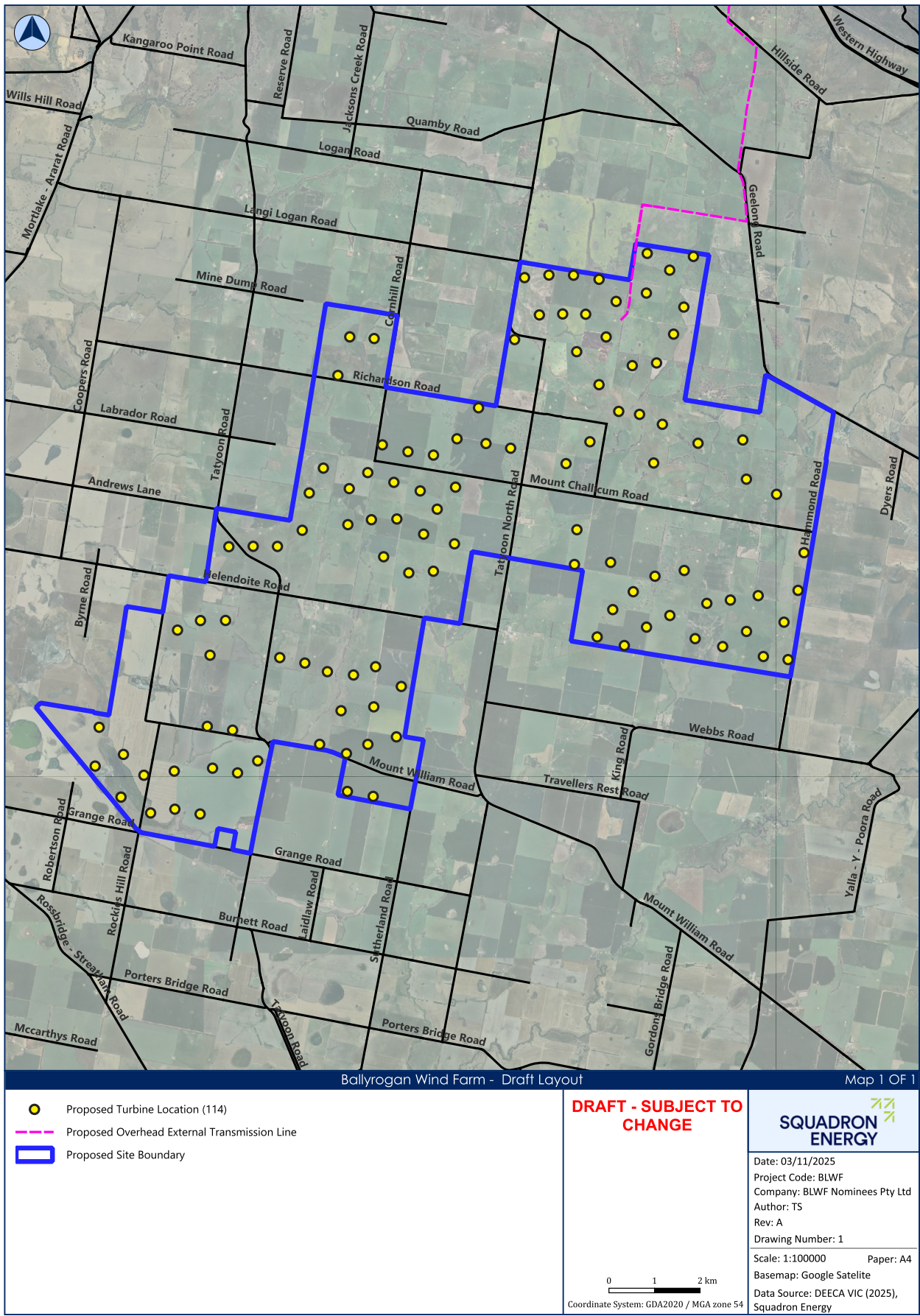
Ballyrogan Wind Farm is a proposed renewable energy project located on Eastern Maar Country, around 10 kilometres south of Ararat.

This newsletter provides project updates, as well as information in response to key feedback we've heard from the community as part of our ongoing engagement.

Since announcing the project in late June 2025, the project team have met with host landowners, neighbours and members of the local community. In response to feedback, the project design has been revised, resulting in an overall reduction of the project footprint and number of wind turbines proposed.

The revised layout includes 114 wind turbines, down from the original proposal of 164. The new layout also ensures that nearby dwellings are located at least 2km from the nearest wind turbine, unless otherwise agreed. The layout may continue to be revised as development of the project progress, based on the results of technical and environmental assessments and ongoing engagement.

Community investment

Squadron Energy is committed to leaving a lasting legacy in the communities where we operate. One way we do this is through long-term community investment programs. These include community benefit funds, sponsorships, voluntary neighbour agreements, grants and direct or in-kind contributions such as infrastructure upgrades.

We aim to deliver meaningful local benefits, including employment, business opportunities and partnerships with First Nations communities.

We will invest at least \$1,050 per megawatt of Ballyrogan Wind Farm's final capacity each year – starting from the commencement of construction and continuing for the life of our project. Based on our current expected capacity, this means approximately \$21 million will be shared with the community over the life of our project.
