Item	Details and Actions
1.0 Welcome and Introductions	Meeting opened at 10.15am. David Johnson welcomed those present, and noted the apologies he had received. He particularly welcomed Kath Elliott, Head of Stakeholder & Community Engagement with Squadron Energy, and Cr. Jess Jennings, Mayor of Bathurst Regional Council.
2.0 Acknowledgement of Country	The Chair acknowledged the Wiradjuri people, the Traditional Owners of the land on which the meeting is being held and paid respects to their elders past, present and emerging.
3.0 Declarations of Interest	None.

4.0 Correspondence	<ul> <li>The Chair noted further email correspondence received from Mid-Western Council on 28/11/23 relating to the allocation of VPA funding monies.</li> <li>The Chair also noted correspondence from both Councils in January 2024, nominating new representatives for the CCC – Cr Des Kennedy for Mid-Western and Mayor Jess Jennings for Bathurst.</li> </ul>
5.0 Minutes of Previous Meeting	<ul> <li>It was noted that the last meeting of the CCC was held on 15 August 2023. There were no comments made regarding the previous minutes;</li> <li>Action Items:</li> <li>1. DJ noted the above-mentioned correspondence from Mid-Western Council on VPA funding allocations (dated 28/11/23), which he tabled. He had also sent an email to Mid-Western Council on 29/9/23 confirming that members of the CCC feel strongly that VPA monies should be spent in the local area, not elsewhere in the LGA.</li> <li>2. DJ confirmed that he had sent an email to Andrew Hundy asking if he wished to remain on the CCC, and he had replied that he did wish to continue as a member.</li> </ul>
6.0 Proponent's Report	<ul> <li>MM noted that weed-spraying has continued in disturbed areas, also roadworks on Crudine Rd and some internal tracks. Annual turbine maintenance program commences on 9/4/24 over about 3 months; also some blade repairs due to lightning damage</li> <li>MM will be moving to the Uungula wind farm project, which is shortly to commence construction, later in the year</li> </ul>

7.0 Other Agenda Items	VPA funding: KE reported approaches from
	community members re the allocation of VPA
	funds – referring to Mid-Western Council (MWC)
	area.
	• DJ noted the correspondence he sent to the two
	Councils in 2023 and the replies from both. KE
	noted that MWC's letter of 28/11/23 advised that
	it is Council's discretion how and where funds
	are committed. The VPA actually notes that the
	money is to be spent in the land surrounding the
	wind farm. Squadron will write to Council to seek
	clarification on whether funds have been spent,
	and if so where they have been spent.
	MP noted that Bathurst Council spent their share
	in the Sofala and Wattle Flat areas.
	ORJ suggested possibly funding some tourist
	information, display map or similar at the public
	area near Aarons Pass on the Castlereagh Hwy.
	He also considers that some of the local history
	in the area could also qualify for funding in some
	way.
	AH noted that some improvements to the     Cruding Hall aguid alog gualify for funding
	Crudine Hall could also qualify for funding.
	<ul> <li>It was agreed by all members that the CCC should pressure MWC to allocate VPA funds to</li> </ul>
	the local area. Both KE (on behalf of Squadron)
	and DJ (on behalf of the CCC) to write to MWC
	to press this point, and to ask about allocation of
	funds to date. (ACTION ITEM).
	• <u>Terms of Reference</u> : DJ noted that, as required
	under the new CCC Guidelines, he has prepared
	a Terms of Reference for this CCC, which was
	circulated to members late in 2023. He received
	no comments, so that draft has been adopted as
	the final.
	• DJ also reminded members that we are all
	required to accept and sign the new Code of
	Conduct forms and that he has hard copies
	which can be signed today

	done that before in some cases, and could
	possibly contribute in some way.
	<ul> <li>ACTION: Squadron to explore ways in which they could help farmers to deal with the Sefton</li> </ul>
	Bush problem.
	<ul> <li>BZ reported that some of the water tanks left after construction of the W/F are not being menaged a</li> </ul>
	construction of the WF are not being managed o accessible for RFS to use for fire fighting as the
	often cannot be tapped in case of need. A
	example is the one at Aarons Pass on the Castlereagh Highway. The intention was that

	issues such as power connections and high
	voltage transmission line requirements.
