We are currently finalising the Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) to be submitted to the Department of Planning and Environment (NSW).

GREEN ENERGY HUB

Dubbo Firming Power Station has been named as part of the Dubbo Regional Council's Central-West Orana Renewable Energy Zone Green Energy Hub which links different renewable energy companies into one supply chain based in Dubbo.

The project team is working with Council to determine the viability of using recycled effluent water from the Dubbo Sewerage Treatment Plant to create green hydrogen to be used to generate power.



LOCAL WORKFORCE AND PROCUREMENT STRATEGY

We are in the process of preparing a Local Workforce and Procurement Strategy for all projects in the Central West and Orana region including Dubbo Firming Power Station, Spicers Creek Wind Farm and Ungula Wind Farm.

Some of the key objectives of this strategy are to ensure that:

- the local workforce and businesses/service providers can share in the significant opportunities afforded during the construction and operation of these projects
- any potential impact from the demand for local workers and services including accommodation is identified and appropriately managed across all of the projects and in consultation and collaboration with the local councils and other proponents of major projects in the region
