Dear Adrian,

We appreciated the opportunity to meet you at the Danthonia Community ('Danthonia') on Friday, 7 August to discuss the Sapphire Wind Farm project.

Firstly, I would like to thank you for the photomontage you provided, which gives us some guidance as to the potential visual impact of the proposed Sapphire Wind Farm (the 'proposal') on Danthonia and its residents.

We confirm that Danthonia is a growing residential community, with development consent for an integrated community of up to 400 people. As advised, the current population at Danthonia stands at around 150 residents.

Danthonia is the primary community of Church Communities Australia ('CCA'), a recognised religious order, formerly known as Bruderhof Communities in Australia Ltd ('BCA'). We are the Australian branch of Church Communities International ('CCI'), which has its headquarters in New York state, USA. CCI funded the original property purchase and subsequently CCA's start up in Australia.

In 1999, CCI delegates selected Danthonia as the prime location at which to start a community in Australia. The natural beauty of the property and the surrounding rural landscape was a significant factor in selecting Danthonia.

It took BCA from 1999 until into 2003 to gain permission to accommodate and grow our community at Danthonia. An amendment to the Inverell Shire's Local Environment Plan was approved in 2002 by then NSW Planning Minister Dr Andrew Refshauge, following extensive reviews by the NSW departments responsible for water, agriculture, regional development, and planning. Approval of BCA's Development Application followed in 2003.

Since then we have sought to develop the Danthonia community and our adjacent landholdings (including the 'Dursley' property, immediately east of Danthonia) in a manner that shows respect for and sensitivity to the natural surroundings and heritage of the local landscape. This includes considerable investment in best-practice land care. For example, we have planted tens of thousands of trees on our properties in an effort to sustain the environment and encourage flora and fauna, particularly birds.

In 2006, CCA acquired 'Swan Peak', a property immediately north of Danthonia. Swan Peak is a distinctive landmark of significance to the Indigenous community, and is well-loved by Danthonia's residents and local neighbours as much for its profile on the community's northern horizon as for the recreation and views its slopes afford.

With this in mind the prospect of a major wind farm located so close to our property and also falling within a significant sweep of our view field is of great concern to CCA and the Danthonia community residents.

Having reviewed Wind Prospect's Preliminary Environmental Assessment ('PEA') for the project and the Director-General's Requirements ('DGRs') published by the NSW Department of Planning, we note that community consultation is a key component of the planning and environmental process for the project and in particular a matter which must be addressed in detail in the Environmental Assessment which Wind Prospect is now preparing.

We would anticipate that a development on the scale you propose would be subject to at least as stringent a review process as our initial application to develop a community at Danthonia. We are, therefore, genuinely concerned that a residential community as large as ours has only just now been contacted by Wind Prospects regarding the wind farm proposal.

As you would be well aware, both the AusWind Best Practice Guidelines for Wind Farm Developments, noted as a 'key reference' document in Wind Prospect's PEA, and AusWind's Wind Farms and Landscapes Values: National Assessment Framework ('Framework'), referenced in the DGRs as relevant guidelines, point out the importance of any wind farm proponent engaging stakeholders at a very early stage of the project.

As a landowner and large community who is likely to be significantly affected by the project we would appreciate your advice as to how Wind Prospect will follow AusWind's Framework, which recommends distinct steps in the assessment of landscape values process. We strongly believe that either certain preliminary stakeholder consultation has been overlooked or alternatively may be just beginning, if our recent meeting is anything to go by. In this regard we note that Step 1A of the Framework recommends that initial investigation *'include preliminary community input through direct consultation...'*.

It would be helpful to us if you would provide us with an outline of the consultation process Wind Prospect proposes to undertake insofar as it relates to the DGRs and more importantly to CCA and our community. Further, we ask that you keep us informed of major developments or alterations to the project.

In view of the above we believe the most appropriate course of action is to meet with you and your project team to obtain more detailed information from you about the project and also to discuss possible modifications to the project to alleviate any issues of concern to CCA and the community. Finally, we have retained several experts to assist us in evaluating the likely visual impact the proposal has on our community and hopefully also to assist you in assessing this level of impact with the aim of reducing any such visual impact.

I would appreciate your advice as to when we could meet so that we can work with you to address what I believe are the legitimate concerns of CCA and the Danthonia Community.

Reference is made to the proposed project application by Wind Prospect CWP Pty Ltd ('Wind Prospect') for the Sapphire Wind Farm in the Inverell Local Government Area.

We act for Church Communities Australia Limited who are the proprietors of the properties known as 'Danthonia'/'Shanta Clare', 'Dursley' and 'Swan Peak' on the Glen Innes Road at Inverell (henceforth referred to as 'the Danthonia Properties'). These lands are specifically as follows:

As you are aware, our client operates an integrated community at the Danthonia properties where currently 175 persons reside and with approval for up to 400 persons. In addition, the site includes community facilities, church and religious premises, a sign-making factory as well as other community and agricultural uses. The Danthonia community's sensitivity to the impacts of wind turbines located in its visual catchment are significantly heightened from those experienced by other landowners for two reasons:

1. the significantly greater number of persons potentially exposed to impacts; and

2. the special nature of the religious and community uses on Danthonia means that impacts on the spiritual and contemplative experience of users of Danthonia would be of a qualitatively more severe nature than those experienced by the normal users of agricultural lands.

It is noted that Wind Prospect released two layouts of turbine locations but that subsequently the company is in the process of reviewing and revising these layouts. It is further noted that Wind Prospect gave a commitment to Church Communities Australia Limited for further consultation following the revision of the turbine layout plans.

Church Communities Australia Limited have engaged Mr Michael Wright of the leading visual assessment consulting firm, Spackman Mossop Michaels, to review the potential impacts of the turbine layout plans on the Danthonia properties. While this assessment was based upon the previous turbine layouts proposed by Wind Prospect, it identifies particular areas of high sensitivity where the installation of wind turbines should be avoided. While it is appreciated that Wind Prospect are currently revising the turbine layout, this report in identifying areas of high sensitivity, assists in delineating areas where the location of turbines should be avoided. Hence, it is considered this assessment would be of assistance to Wind Prospect in the revision of its turbine layouts and would assist in a co-operative and consensual resolution of any issues between Wind Prospect and Church Communities Australia Limited.

We attach a copy of the report from Spackman Mossop Michaels which is self-explanatory. It should be noted that the recommendations in this report have been limited to only those locations with severe and unacceptable impacts on the Danthonia properties as it is recognised that simply seeking to exclude wind turbines from the visual catchment of the Danthonia properties or seeking an arbitrary exclusion zone are not practical outcomes having regard to the objectives of Wind Prospect.

Therefore, the high sensitivity exclusion zones identified by the Spackman Mossop Michaels report provide a minimalist approach to exclusionary zones based upon maximum impacts. It will be noted there are two primary exclusion areas:

- (a) the highly prominent skyline ridge area adjacent to Swan Peak, with the Swan Peak mountain identified as a highly significant regional landform feature where additional protection is justified and where it is additionally noted Swan Peak forms an important visual landmark not merely for neighbouring properties but for the general public travelling between Inverell and Glen Innes; and
- (b) the rear field Valley area to the east of Danthonia where the high density of turbines provides significant visual clutter to the rear field view from Danthonia.

Our clients are seriously concerned about the potential impacts of the proposed wind farm on its operations. However, we have undertaken this visual assessment to seek to find common ground and options where the Danthonia community can co-exist with Wind Prospect's Sapphire Wind Farm.

We would be happy to discuss in detail the proposals contained in the attached report with a view to reaching an in principle agreement on the future layout proposed by your company. To this end, Chris Voll from Church Communities Australia will contact Mr Adrian Maddocks from your company to arrange a convenient time for a discussion between the representatives of Church Communities Australia Limited and Wind Prospect.

I have just been looking at the two turbine location maps on your website and I am intrigued as to why on the map of the 3.3 mw locations which obviously has 31 less towers than the 2.2 ms why you would have left the four towers insitue, which are the bone of contention for the concerned Wellingrove residents, and removed in particular the seven towers in a semi- circle on the eastern boundary of the property "Osterly" which should be of no concern to anybody. Dear Adrian,

As Simon has recently left our company, I will be taking over his role in liaising with you regarding the placement of the proposed bio-banking sites. Two of these sites, outlined in your correspondence (attached) may have the potential to sterilize sapphire resource (as discussed by Simon in his email below).

Basically, in this region, land that is level and usually covered by degraded grassland (alluvial flats) we would wish to keep available for exploration and mining. Land that is on sloping or hilly ground, and often covered with remnant stands of native vegetation does not have likely potential for sapphire resource.

Within your proposed bio-banking sites, the areas of interest to us, and those that we would not wish to see excluded from mining and exploration are:

- 1. The northern portion of your southernmost bio-banking area near Mt Buckley where it covers alluvial ground south of the road (could you instead take up some of the more hilly vegetated ground closer to or within your defined wind farm area).
- 2. The eastern portion of your bio-banking area west of the intersection of the Western Feeder road and the Swan Brook Road again where it sits over flat open pastureland.

Please see attached correspondence from Wind Prospect re their wind farm proposals for Kings Plains.

They are proposing 4 separate bio-banking areas at Kings Plains within both AGR & Volcan tenements.

My recommendation with respect to the proposed bio-banking areas near Mt Buckley and immediately west of the intersection of the Western Feeder road and the Swan Brook road, at the northern and southern ends of Kings Plains Creek, is that ARG should object strongly to the gazettal of those two areas as bio-banking sites (*which if they go ahead will exclude exploration and mining over those areas in the future*), as they have significant sapphire prospectivity value.

This matter needs to be dealt with by you and Sholom asap if you want to preserve the ground in question (*I did mention this matter to Sholom many weeks ago, but I am not sure if anything was done*).






