Project update

Uungula Wind Farm is now five months into construction, with the Twelve Mile Road upgrade well underway.

Work on Twelve Mile Road currently includes:

- removing the old bitumen surface
- laying a stabilising road base material to get ready to lay the new bitumen surface
- widening and upgrading existing culverts underneath the road
- excavating and removing old culverts
- installing new rock walls.

To protect water sources during this work, we have installed environmental controls to prevent sediment from entering the water.

All work is required to comply with the project's planning approval conditions as well as strict state government requirements.

The Twelve Mile Road upgrade will improve conditions for road users and allow the delivery of equipment and components needed for project construction. Completion of the upgrade is currently expected for early 2025, weather and site conditions permitting.

Twelve Mile Road vegetation benefits local Landcare group

The Mid Macquarie Landcare Group recently benefited from the Twelve Mile Road construction work.

As part of the early work for the road upgrade, trees were assessed and some were removed or trimmed. Each tree was inspected prior to removal, ensuring no wildlife was present. Larger logs were left for a period of time in case the trees were being used for habitat. Fewer trees were required to be removed than originally planned and the removal of overhanging branches along the road has increased driver visibility and user safety.

The removed trees were mulched and donated to the Mid Macquarie Landcare Group for their new community garden in Wellington.

The forums were attended by more than 50 local businesspeople from a range of companies looking to provide construction and trade services, traffic and transport management and workforce accommodation.



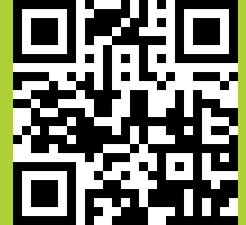
Community sponsorship highlight – Wellington Warriors
